74,591

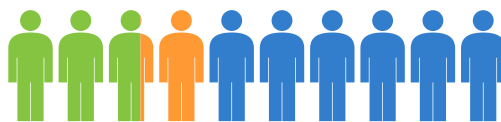
clients assisted in attaining affordable housing through permanent housing services.

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING AND SHELTER SERVICES

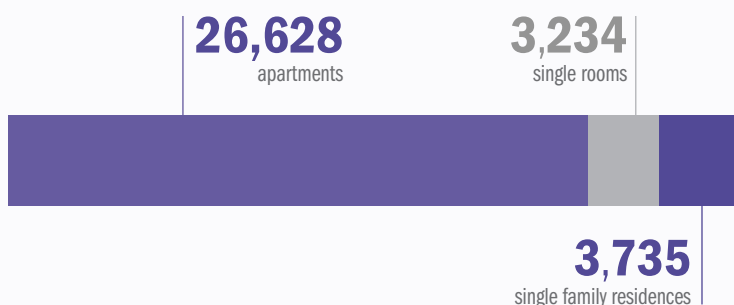
Among agencies that provided temporary shelter services, **70 agencies** reported operating or managing **238 shelters** with a total of **10,189 beds** available. These services are particularly valuable for vulnerable populations including those listed below as well as veterans, seniors, ex-offenders and runaway youth.

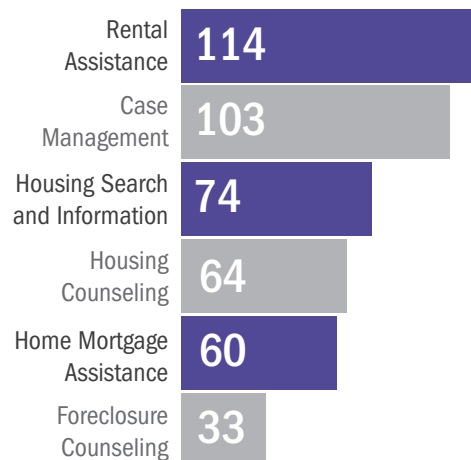
